## **Seventh Annual "March of Light" Halloween Parade To Take Place on October 27th**

(SAN FRANCISCO) – Community organizers are planning the sixth annual Halloween celebration, "March of Light" on Saturday, October 27<sup>th</sup> at 6:30 p.m. **Groups and individuals can obtain registration materials in advance by visiting the <http://www.marchoflight.org> web site.**

The public is invited to join participants in lighted costumes, dance groups, art cars, dance floats and costumed entrants, as the Parade makes its way through the City's Castro District. The Parade will begin on 19<sup>th</sup> near Collingwood Park, continue north on Castro to Market, turn right on Market to Dolores and head south on Dolores to 19<sup>th</sup> at Dolores Park.

"Our long term intention is to create a City-wide parade on Halloween night beginning in the Castro and ending at the Embarcadero with a huge fireworks celebration! This exciting seventh year voyage continues our journey towards this vision." says Jim Lightsey, Founder and one of the Organizers from the volunteer-driven March of Light Foundation.

Created to "Celebrate Life and the Day of the Dead," the March of Light continues to grow in scope to include members of numerous communities drawn together for a common celebration of Halloween creativity and human spirit. This year's Parade will be organized into four movements, each representing a unique aspect of the cycle of life: Fire, Death, Light and Celebration. In addition, participations for the first time will be invited to place something in remembrance or celebration into a specially designed "Cauldron of ReCreation" at the terminus of the Parade.
